## A BILL

To prohibit the use of Federal funds for direct cash assistance in Taliban-controlled Afghanistan.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "No More Taxpayer

5 Cash for the Taliban Act".

## 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS; SENSE OF CONGRESS.

- 7 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:
- 8 (1) Billions of United States taxpayer dollars9 are being flown into Afghanistan, where they are di-

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rectly and indirectly benefiting the illegitimate
 Taliban regime.

3 (2) The sudden and disorganized withdrawal of
4 the United States military presence in Afghanistan
5 ordered by the President in August 2021 desta6 bilized the Afghan National Security Forces, leading
7 to the Taliban taking control of Kabul on August
8 15, 2021.

9 (3) According to the Special Inspector General 10 for Afghanistan Reconstruction (SIGAR), since Au-11 gust 2021, the United Nations has purchased and 12 transported at least \$2,900,000,000 for use in Af-13 ghanistan.

(4) As of January 2024, of the \$2,900,000,000
that the United Nations has sent to Taliban-controlled Afghanistan since August 2021, the United
States Government has provided \$2,600,000,000 of
taxpayer dollars.

19 (5) Inside Afghanistan, the United Nations
20 uses this United States currency to buy local cur21 rency, afghani, from the Taliban-controlled central
22 bank of Afghanistan, Da Afghanistan Bank (DAB).
23 (6) According to SIGAR, the Taliban has di24 rectly and indirectly benefited from United States

25 currency shipments to Afghanistan in multiple ways.

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1	(7) The Taliban "taxes" direct cash assistance,
2	stealing millions of United States taxpayer dollars.
3	(8) The Taliban charges currency exchange fees
4	when international organizations convert United
5	States currency into afghani using DAB.
6	(9) The revenues from aid taxation and cur-
7	rency exchange fees can be used by the Taliban to
8	fund their priorities, including their military and se-
9	curity services.
10	(10) The influx of United States currency into
11	the Taliban-controlled central bank has propped up
12	the value of the afghani.
13	(11) United Nations purchases of afghani from
14	the Taliban-controlled central bank have provided
15	the Taliban with millions in largely untraceable
16	United States currency.
17	(b) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of Con-
18	gress that no taxpayer dollars should be given to support
19	the illegitimate Taliban regime in Afghanistan.
20	SEC. 3. PROHIBITIONS.
21	(a) Direct Cash Assistance Prohibited.—Not-
22	withstanding any other provision of law, no Federal funds
23	may be made available by any Federal department or
24	agency in the form of direct cash assistance to any person
25	in Afghanistan.

1 (b) Assistance to United Nations and Other 2 NONGOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS LIMITED.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no Federal funds 3 may be obligated or expended by any Federal department 4 5 or agency to provide funds to the United Nations, a non-6 governmental organization, or a public international orga-7 nization, if such funds will be used to provide direct cash 8 assistance to any person in Afghanistan.

9 (c) PROHIBITION ON SALE OF UNITED STATES CUR-10 RENCY TO THE UNITED NATIONS.—Notwithstanding any 11 other provision of law, the Board of Governors of the Fed-12 eral Reserve System may not sell, or authorize a Federal 13 reserve bank to sell, United States currency to the United 14 Nations for the purpose of direct cash assistance in Af-15 ghanistan.
